## 5. Old Business

### a) Broadband Program Update

Entrikin said he expects to hear award announcements from the Washington State Broadband Office by the end of March regarding the three grant applications/funding opportunities submitted by the PUD.

Port/PUD Broadband Steering Committee – will be adding a staff member from Whatcom County. The Interlocal Agreement is in the process of being amended for this purpose.

Commissioner Deshmane commented on providing retail options for broadband.

### b) Adjudication Update

House Bill 1792 is now on the agenda for the House Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources. WPUDA's Bill Clarke will testify. Regarding the Budget Proviso – this past week, the State Department of Ecology (DOE) has provided edits, as well as the tribes. Sitkin continues to monitor.

# 6. New Business

## a) Nooksack Salmon Enhancement Association Presentation

The District has been supporting fish habitat restoration projects with Nooksack Salmon Enhancement Association (NSEA) since 2010. This funding request for 2023 is \$20,000. Darrell Gray, NSEA Project Manager, provided an overview of 2022 activities and update for projects planned for 2023.

There is no fiscal impact to the District as funding has been allocated in the 2023 budget for this purpose.

**ACTION**: Commissioner Grant motioned to APPROVE FUNDING IN THE AMOUNT OF \$20,000 FOR NOOKSACK SALMON ENHANCEMENT ASSOCIATION TO SUPPORT WASHINGTON CONSERVATION CREW WORK ON HABITAT RESTORATION PROJECTS FOR 2023. Commissioner Arnett second the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

## b) Award of Bid: Water Treatment Plant 1 – Pump #5 Variable Frequency Drive (VFD)

The District 2023 Capital Improvement Project list includes the installation of a new variable frequency drive (VFD) on the Plant 1 High Head 5 (RW-35). The installation of a VFD will assist water operations in the management of water flow to District customers, as well as increase the electrical efficiency of the plant. On March 3, 2023 the District received and publicly read aloud one (1) bid submitted for this project.

\$513,146.50 (tax not inc.)

Engineer's Estimate

\$722,469.82 (tax not inc.)

Staff recommends awarding the contract for the Plant 1 High Head 5 VFD to Mills Electric Co. Due to the total contract amount being less than the Engineer's Estimate of \$722,469.82 and the PUD's internal capital budget amount of \$650,000.00, there is no foreseen fiscal impact. This project is budgeted in the 2023 Capital Improvements Budget.

**ACTION:** Commissioner Grant made the motion to AWARD THE PLANT 1 HIGH HEAD 5 VFD CONTRACT TO MILLS ELECTRIC CO. AND AUTHORIZE THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT. Commissioner Arnett second the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

## c) Call for Special Meeting

The District will hold a Special Commission Meeting to present a brief overview of the PUD's Electric System Expansion Feasibility Study and receive public comment. The meeting will be held on Thursday, April 13, 2023, at the Pioneer Park Pavilion, located at 2007 Cherry Street in Ferndale, from 4 PM to 6 PM. The agenda is forthcoming.

**ACTION**: Commissioner Grant made the motion to CALL FOR A SPECIAL MEETING ON APRIL 13, 2023, LOCATED AT PIONEER PARK PAVILION, 2007 CHERRY STREET, FERNDALE, FROM 4 PM TO 6 PM. Commissioner Arnett second the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

### 7. General Manager Report

- Walters is covering for Heimgartner. No report.
- Grant asked the following be passed along to Heimgartner She is seeking status on the Interlocal Agreement with County for GIS assistance, and when the Request for Proposals regarding District's renewable energy project will be ready.

#### 8. Operations Report

• Walters reported Washington State announced results of its first greenhouse-gas allowance auction raised an estimated \$300 million. The Department of Ecology announced Tuesday it had sold all of its almost 6.2 million allowances, each representing one metric ton of greenhouse-gas emissions. The settlement price was \$48.50 per ton, more than double the starting price of \$22.20.

- Completed his part on the Communications Plan for the Electric Expansion Feasibility Study release.
- Commented the effects of diesel (and snow) and possibly helping other ski areas that depend on diesel generators.
- He is interested in energy supply options and would like to begin attending monthly meetings with Public Power Council (Portland, OR) with Commission approval in advance.
